

Hyd man chops off son's hand for watching porn

A father angered by his teenager's addiction to watch pornographic films on his smartphone has chopped off his right hand from the wrist.



Sunday when his father caught him red-handed. When he tried to snatch the phone from his hand Khalid bit his father's hand and fled from home. After returning home late in the night he continued to watch the movies which led to further altercation on Monday.

After the incident the father Mohammed Abdul Qayyum Qureshi was arrested at the Pabidshah police station in the old city of Hyderabad on Monday.

According to the police Abdul Qayyum, a resident of Jalapally Colony had been warning his 19-year-old son Khalid Qureshi for quite some time against spending too much time on his smartphone, specially watching the porn.

Khalid who was working as an assistant in a TV cable operator's office was as usual watching movies on his mobile on Sunday when his father caught him red-handed. When he tried to snatch the phone from his hand Khalid bit his father's hand and fled from home. After returning home late in the night he continued to watch the movies which led to further altercation on Monday.

An angry Abdul Qayyum, butcher by profession used his knife to chop off Khalid's right hand. While other shocked family members and neighbors rushed him to hospital, Abdul Qayyum went to police station and surrendered to the police investigating officer on duty about his action.

Khalid was admitted to Osmania General Hospital where doctors said that as his hand was severed 90% possibility of its restoration was bleak.

According to the family members, Khalid, one of the four children of Qayyum was lethargic and used to spend most of his time on phone. After much persuasion he had recently joined the private job but was irregular at work.

Pabidshah police has booked an attempt to murder case against Abdul Qayyum, and was remanded to judicial custody.

While, continuing in Ram jethalmani, Dawood had said that he was prepared to return to India to face trial in cases where he had been named as an accused. Dawood said that he does not want to move abroad the country to face trials in various cases. It is another matter which he did not materialise.

Land scam: Probe against Cardinal

Syro-Malabar Church faces unprecedented crisis

The Syro-Malabar Catholic Church fell into an unprecedented crisis on Tuesday with the Kerala High Court ordering a probe against its head, Major Archbishop Cardinal Mar George Alencherry, in connection with a controversial sale of land belonging to the Ernakulam-Angamaly Archdiocese which brought huge financial losses to the diocese.

Justice B Kernal Pasha of the High Court ordered that a probe be held against the Cardinal, two senior priests of the Archdiocese and the middleman who facilitated the land sale.

Unconfirmed reports on Tuesday evening said that Mar Alencherry had expressed his readiness to step down to the bishops of the Church in the context of the embarrassing court order even as the Church called for emergency synod to discuss the order and its possible fallout and to decide on damage-controlling strategies.

Justice Kernal Pasha stressed the order for investigation by rejecting all arguments put forward by the counsel of the Cardinal to avoid it and with some extremely harsh observations directly against Mar Alencherry like "The Cardinal is not king." This is the first time a senior cardinal is facing such a critical situation in his entire history.

The issue pertains to the sale of over three acres of prime land belonging to the Archdiocese for mobilising funds to repay a hefty bank loan availed for a now-aborted medical college project. The prime land was sold through middleman Saju Varghese allegedly for less than one-third of the price it could fetch, causing losses to the tune of crores of rupees to the diocese.

All the sale documents were signed by the Cardinal and the charge against him is that he had carried out the deal without proper discussions in the order for investigation by rejecting all arguments put forward by the counsel of the Cardinal to avoid it and with some extremely harsh observations directly against Mar Alencherry like "The Cardinal is not king."

irregularities involved in the land sale carried out under the direct supervision of Mar Alencherry.

As per the court order issued on a petition filed by one Shine Varghese of Cheralala, Alappuzha, the Ernakulam Central Police Station is registering an FIR against the Cardinal. Archdiocese's finance officer Father Joshi Puthuva, Vicar General Monsignor Sebastian Vadakkumpadam and Saju Varghese, the middleman who facilitated the land sale.

Unconfirmed reports on Tuesday evening said that Mar Alencherry had expressed his readiness to step down to the bishops of the Church in the context of the embarrassing court order even as the Church called for emergency synod to discuss the order and its possible fallout and to decide on damage-controlling strategies.

Justice Pasha ordered the investigation on Tuesday by observing that the land deal was shrouded in a cloud which had to be removed. Said that the land deal seemed to be mysterious, the judge said there was enough reason to believe that there was a conspiracy behind it. He noted above the law of the land and that Canon Law was irrelevant in matters pertaining to crimes committed within the church.

Lawyer of Mumbai blasts mastermind's brother tells court

Pakistan-based underworld lion Dawood Ibrahim, who is wanted in the 1993 Mumbai blasts case, "wants to return to India to face trial in cases registered against him but on the condition that he is lodged at the Arthur Road prison," his brother Ibrahim Ibrahim Kaskar's defence lawyer Shyam Keswani claimed before a Thane court on Tuesday.

During the course of a hearing of an extortion case

filed against him and six others at Thane, Keswani made a "revelation" to this effect, quoting renowned criminal lawyer Ram Jethalmani in whom Dawood had confided his desire to return to India.

Keswani told the court that Dawood was ready to come to India and undergo trial for the 1993 Mumbai blasts case. Keswani said "wants to return to India to face trial in cases registered against him but on the condition that he is lodged at the Arthur Road prison," his brother Ibrahim Ibrahim Kaskar's defence lawyer Shyam Keswani claimed before a Thane court on Tuesday.

During the course of a hearing of an extortion case

Initially, Kaskar had been booked in this case. Subsequently, the names of his brothers Dawood and Aneez Ibrahim were added. Interestingly, this is the first such extortion case in which all three Ibrahim brothers — Kaskar, Dawood and Aneez have been named as accused.

'Follow UGC norms in principals' appointment'

The Kerala State committee of the Unnatha Vidyalayabhyasa Adhyapak Sangham (UVAS) has asked the Government and universities in the State to strictly follow UGC regulations while making appointments to the posts of college principals.

That so far the Government and universities had only flouted the UGC norms in such matters had many times been borne out by frequent court orders quashing such appointments including those of the vice-chancellors, the UVAS alleged in a release.

Many of those occupying the position of principal were disqualified and were continuing without approval, they being far short of the UGC prescribed qualifications, the outfit said. Most of them lacked even in communication language along the academic performance indicator score like research publications in peer-reviewed journals and books of international standard, it said.

Alleging that they even ceased to teach the students once they became principals as they were principal clerks and not principal teachers, the UVAS said if the system was allowed to continue like this it would cause unprecedented damage to collegiate education.

2 years work in UP rural areas compulsory for medical students

Students pursuing medical courses in the State will have to work in rural areas at least for two years before taking up any other career. A decision in this regard was taken at a cabinet meeting in Luckhawan on Tuesday morning.
