

### 38-year delay in Narela corridor appalling: HC

THE DELHI High Court has expressed displeasure over the delay in starting work on the Integrated Freight Corridor (IFC) project. The project was initiated at Narela in 1980.

Pulling up the Delhi Development Authority (DDA), a bench of Acting Chief Justice Gita Mittal and Justice C Hari Shankar said, "A project which originally began in September, 1980, has thus not even commenced. This speaks volumes about the apathy of the DDA in the whole matter. The complete lack of any action on the part of the DDA is appalling."

It added, "We are inclined to burden the DDA with exemplary costs for non-action in the matter. However, we are desisting from doing so and are giving it one opportunity to get its act together and ensure that expeditive steps are taken to implement other steps in the matter and to ensure that the IFC is activated at the earliest."

The bench said that the DDA allotted land for the IFC to various authorities and persons, and thereafter "slept over the matter" without ensuring implementation of court orders to shift the trade of chemicals and dangerous explosives there.

The court issued the directives while hearing a plea by the NGO Society for Awareness and Development, seeking to shift wholesale markets from the walled city to the IFC.

# Court pulls up police over absent witness

A CITY court pulled up the Delhi Police, asking how they can be believed every time they claim non-availability of public witnesses during apprehension of a suspect or arrest of an accused in any crime.

Stating that "casual claims" have become a "routine" part of the functioning of police, Metropolitan Magistrate Rakesh Kumar Singh acquitted an accused in an Arms Act case — which only had police personnel as witnesses.

On January 21, 2011, police had arrested the accused from east Delhi based on inputs from a "secret informer".

They also seized a "desi katta" containing one cartridge. The chargesheet was filed in January 2012 and the accused was charged under Section 25 of the Arms Act.

During trial, the prosecution examined eight witnesses — all police personnel.

In his order on May 25, Metropolitan Magistrate Singh said it appears that no public witness was called by the police team during apprehension and even after the arrest — despite the accused being nabbed from a public place in the afternoon.

"Therefore, there cannot be any question of non-availability of persons for joining... proceedings. A mere casual claim of police that no one joined proceedings cannot be accepted. This type of casual claim has become a routine part of the functioning of Delhi Police. It is one thing to say that police cannot be doubted as witness, but it is an entirely a different thing to say that despite availability of public persons, police did not join them for any proceedings, and that they should always be believed," said the court.

It added that there were various inconsistencies in the statements of police personnel regarding the time, clothing worn by different police officers, "writing work" done by the IO of the case among others. The court said this does not "inspire" confidence in the testimonies of different police personnel.

The court also noted that the sanction of arrest was granted by an additional Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP), but he never appeared during recording of evidence in court.

"Even the case property was not brought to the DCP office... In such circumstances, the sanction is completely not reliable. Therefore, the prosecution cannot claim to have established the case," it said.

# Chaos at mohalla clinics due to lack of maintenance, UD minister Jain told

THE FUNCTIONAL mohalla clinics of the Delhi government are witnessing "complete chaos" due to the absence of a proper maintenance system, official records show.

The issue came up at a meeting on transfer of sites for the upcoming clinics and maintenance of the existing ones, chaired by Urban Development Minister Satyendra Jain on May 28.

"The Air Conditioners, LCDs, water coolers/dispensers are not functioning properly, resulting in complete chaos at the AAMCs (Aam Aadmi Mohalla Clinics)," states the document carrying the minutes of the meeting.

The Delhi government had

plans to build 1,000 mohalla clinics, which have earned praise for filling the gap in primary healthcare. However, due to administrative hurdles in acquiring land, only 164 clinics are functional as of now.

Lack of maintenance oversight has also led to teething problems. The nodal officer (health and family welfare) for the project informed officials at the meeting that there is "no maintenance system in place for AAMCs".

# Police recreate scene of attack on doctor

A MONTH after an orthopaedic doctor was injured when gunmen shot at him outside his Mehrauli farmhouse, a team of Delhi Police Crime Branch on Thursday visited the spot and recreated the scene.

On April 29, unidentified assailants opened fire at Dr Hans Nagar, leaving him severely injured. The doctor also fired from his licenced pistol in retaliation.

The identity of the assailants is yet to be ascertained, police said.

Police had recovered around 22 empty cartridges and two live rounds of 9mm and 0.32 bore from the spot.

Sources said that a team, led by JCP (Crime Branch) Alok Kumar and DCP G Ram Gopal Naik, Thursday visited the crime scene around 12.30 pm.

"They spent around two hours at the spot, trying to recreate the scene. The visit comes a day after senior officials met Dr Nagar at the Delhi Police Headquarters," police sources said, adding that police suspect a family dispute over property as the reason behind the attack.

Police had registered a case

under IPC sections of criminal conspiracy, attempt to murder, and under the Arms Act was registered at Fatehpur Beri police station.

Crisis — the special investigation team of south district — had led the initial investigation, but did not find any leads. CCTV cameras too were inconclusive. Later, Delhi Police Commissioner Amulya Patnaik directed DCP (south) Romil Baaniya to transfer the case to the Crime Branch.

Nagar told police that his brothers planned the attack over an ongoing property dispute, said a police officer.

# Inter-state drug cartel busted, 3 held

WITH THE arrest of three persons, the Delhi Police Crime Branch claimed to have busted an inter-state drug cartel that used to smuggle drugs in Delhi and NCR and carry back illicit liquor to Bihar.

According to police, the accused have been identified as Ravi (25), Munna Kumar Jha (30) and Gayopal (62). A truck loaded with 700 kg marijuana was recovered from the accused, said a senior police officer.

JCP (crime), Alok Kumar, said that one Vipin Kumar, who is an alleged drug and liquor lord in Patna, Bihar, procured the marijuana from Naxal-affected areas of Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh for distribution in Delhi-NCR.

"The accused used the drug racket to further procure illicit liquor from Delhi and NCR for distribution in the dry state of Bihar. Vipin has more than 50 members in his organised syndicate spread over many states," said the JCP.

# CM may announce plan on statehood demand today

CHIEF MINISTER Arvind Kejriwal is likely to announce the AAP's plan to launch an extensive campaign on full statehood, ahead of the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, in the Assembly on Friday.

Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia has already signalled that the AAP will not only raise the pitch over the issue but also attempt to establish it as the prime factor behind the government's inability to push through proposals such as the Jan Lokpal Bill.

In 2016, the Centre had returned 14 Bills passed by the Delhi Assembly, including the Jan Lokpal Bill, to the Delhi government, citing procedural lapses.

The second day of the session also witnessed uproar over the continued refusal of officers to answer questions posed by MLAs on reserved subjects like appointment of teachers and revenue.

On Thursday, the BJP, led by Leader of Opposition Vijendra Gupta, claimed that the Jan Lokpal Bill is with the Law Department since September, 2017, which was denied by Law Minister Kailash Gahlot.

BJP MLAs sought a debate on

the issue, which was turned down by Speaker Ram Niwas Goel. Later, Gupta and Rajouri Garden MLA Manjinder Singh Sirsa were marshalled out as they repeatedly demanded an apology from Sisodia for stating that the Centre derailed the Jan Lokpal Bill.

Meanwhile, participating in the debate on full statehood, minister Gopal Rai proposed that power and responsibilities be split for the New Delhi Municipal Council and the rest of the city. He said the Centre should be responsible for Lutyens' Delhi while the Delhi government should be in charge of rest of the city — an observation that is likely to be made part of the resolution which will be passed on Friday.

# Cut down on use of plastic in courts: HC

EMPHASISING ON the need to preserve the environment, Delhi High Court Acting Chief Justice Gita Mittal Thursday said immediate steps need to be taken to minimise plastic utilisation, especially single-use plastic items including pens and other stationery items, in courts.

The judge also issued an administrative order, directing the high court and all district courts in the capital to take immediate steps to replace plastic items.

"Global concerns of environment degradation, as well as those of pollution and waste management in Delhi, render it imperative that immediate steps are taken to reduce the carbon footprints of all our actions and reduce contribution to waste generation in Delhi and the courts," the order said.

It said a direction shall be issued by the Registrar General of the High Court to all its branches and district courts.

"In case there are stocks available of such items, after their utilisation, they shall not be replaced with single use plastic items, unless they are irreplaceable. In case of any difficulty, the same be immediately brought to notice," said the order.

A committee has been con-

stituted in the HC — which will be headed by its Registrar General Dinesh Kumar Sharma — to examine the working branches and courts, and identify sources of waste generation (including liquid and solid waste) as well as pollution.

"The committee shall urgently examine and suggest measures for reduction of waste in courts," the order said, adding that a direction has been issued to all district judges to identify a team of three judges who are interested in working on issues related to the environment.

On the occasion of World Environment Day, Justice Mittal had called for planting more trees and doing away with the use of plastic. She had called upon the younger generation to participate in tree plantation and nurture them not only for themselves, but for a "better future for the coming generation".

# BMW catches fire at Kalkaji

AN AUTOMATIC BMW caught fire in the parking lot of south-east Delhi's Kalkaji on Thursday morning. The fire also gutted two other bikes parked nearby.

According to Delhi Fire Service officials, a call was received at 11.10 am and one fire tender was pressed into service.

"It took half-an-hour to douse the fire. Two motorcycles parked near the car also caught fire and were gutted," said a DFS official.

Police said the two occupants of the car, which had a BJP sticker on the number plate, got out in time and escaped unhurt.

"The car belongs to an advocate. His driver had come to drop a family member near Nehru Place when the incident took place," said the fire officer.
